

Pupil premium grant expenditure: 2013/14

Overview of the school

For the academic year September 2013 to July 2014

Funding is received from the 1 April to the following March.

Total number of pupils on roll	203
Total number of pupils eligible for PPG	April 2013 - Funded for 9 children April 2014 – funded for 9 children. However, 13 children over the year became eligible for PPG funding. April 2014 - In addition we had 2 children in receipt of Pupil Premium Plus.
Amount of PPG received per pupil	April 2013 - £1000 April 2014 - £1733 April 2014 – PPG+ - £1,900

Nature of Support

Objectives in spending PPG:

- To ensure that our PPG pupils achieve to their full potential, especially in literacy and maths.
- To ensure our PPG children have access to extra curricular learning activities and resources.
- To ensure PPG children have access to services needed to support their emotional needs both at school and at home.

Curriculum focus of spending 2013 – 2014

One-to-one or small group work related to social skills, reading, phonics, speaking & listening, writing and maths.

One-to-one work with Numbers Count teacher.

Small group work with Numbers First Teaching Assistant.

Small group work with Governor and Headteacher.

Access to a school counsellor.

Extra curricular activities provided for children

Support for getting children to and from school and other necessary provision such as school uniform.

Measuring the Impact:

% of pupils making expected progress in English – 92.3% made expected progress

% of pupils making expected progress in Maths - 92.3% made expected progress

This year our PPG children made better progress in all areas than our non PPG children.

Our current data shows that we are closing the gap for our PPG children.

Some of our PPG children showed increased confidence, higher self esteem and more engaged in learning.
