#### Background of PPSG Money:

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and is only for children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. In our school it is only for children in Year 1 and Year 2.

### Summary of PPSG 2014 - 2015

#### Objectives of spending PPSG:

- To improve the provision of PE at The Brook through raised teacher confidence and equipping them with more effective and specialised skills & equipment in certain sporting activities.
- To encourage children to develop a more active lifestyle through offering taster activities for many local after school clubs.
- To develop a love of sport and physical activity.
- To encourage children to develop into healthy adults.
