


Ice Worlds



Where is the Arctic? What colours can we see?


Who lives in the Arctic? What clothes do they wear? Where do they live? What do they eat?



Which animals live in the Arctic?




Where do penguins live? What do they eat? How many types of penguins are there?

- Learn some facts about Inuit's and different cultures.




How can I help?


