For the academic year September 2014 to July 2015

Funding is received from the 1 April to the following March.

Nature of Support

Objectives in spending PPG:

- To ensure that our PPG pupils achieve to their full potential, especially in literacy and maths.
- To ensure our PPG children have access to extra-curricular learning activities and resources.
- To ensure PPG children have access to services needed to support their emotional needs both at school and at home.

Curriculum focus of spending 2014 – 2015

One-to-one or small group work related to social skills, reading, phonics, speaking & listening, writing and maths.

One-to-one support in class for children with specific needs.

One-to-one work with Numbers Count teacher.

Small group work with First Class at Number Teaching Assistant.

Small group work with Governor and Headteacher.

Access to a school counsellor.

Support with attendance at school.

Access to a Family Support Worker until February 2015.

Extra-curricular activities including funding for trips and clubs provided for children

Support for getting children to and from school and other necessary provision such as school uniform.

Measuring the Impact:**Y2 – 5 children out of 60**

4 out of 5 reached 2B+ - expected level in reading – 80% of the 5 children

3 out of 5 reached 2B+ - expected level in writing – 60% of the 5 children

3 out of 5 reached 2B+ - expected level in maths – 60% of the 5 children

% of pupils making expected progress in Reading – 93% made expected progress

% of pupils making expected progress in Reading – 87% made expected progress

% of pupils making expected progress in Maths - 89% made expected progress

Year 1 – 6 children out of 84

5 out of 6 reached an expected level in reading – 83% of the 6 children

5 out of 6 reached an expected level in writing – 83% of the 6 children

5 out of 6 reached an expected level in maths – 83% of the 6 children

Year Reception – 3 children out of 61

1 out of 3 scored an expected level in reading – 33% of the 3 children

1 out of 3 scored an expected level in writing – 33% of the 3 children

1 out of 3 scored an expected level in maths – 33% of the 3 children

This year our PPG children made better progress in maths than our non PPG children, the same progress in writing and just under in reading.

All of our PPG children showed increased confidence, higher self esteem and more engaged in learning.
